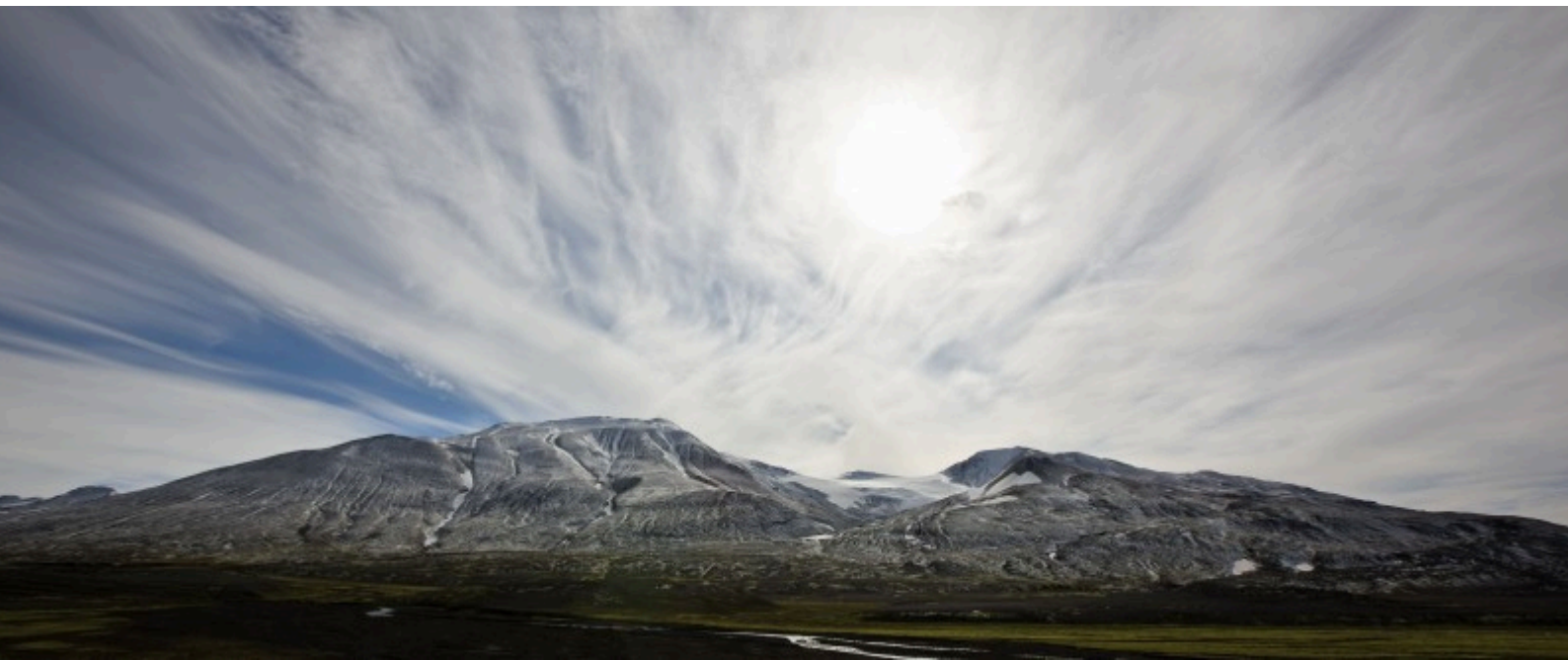

## Trip Overview

This cruise provides a complete circumnavigation of the wild and spectacular island of Iceland, staying on board a comfortable ship with all of your needs taken care of.

This is not a cruise where you will be herded around with thousands of others; the MS Ocean Diamond is designed as an expedition vessel and sleeps a maximum of 224 guests meaning that you see Iceland at its remote and untouched best.

Your ports of call have been determined by experts to ensure that those on board get to experience

the variety of landscapes and experiences which Iceland offers. At each point, there are some exceptional shore excursions to choose from (see the '[personalise](#)' section for details) which mean that you can fully tailor your holiday. There are leisurely trips focused on wildlife, heritage and nature alongside more active excursions to get you up close to the wilderness of this remote island.

During your nine nights on board the MS Ocean Diamond, you will be treated to exceptional service and a great deal of comfort. The experienced crew and expedition team will be on hand throughout as you cruise the coastline. Ocean Diamond was designed for the Arctic and has a strengthened hull for travelling in these icy climes. The ship's smaller size means that she can dock at ports which elude larger vessels and this means that her passengers get to see a great deal more of Iceland's coastline.

There is no compromise on comfort as there are well-equipped and comfortable cabins for guests to relax in and the ship's many facilities include a restaurant where all of your meals are served with panoramic views, a lounge bar area and a very popular Arctic library.

The Iceland cruise departs from and returns to Reykjavik, the most northerly capital in the world. You will have time to explore the city before and after your trip.

The ports of call are outlined below:

- Stykkishólmur – Gateway to the Snaefellsnes Peninsula and the spectacular national park
- Isafjörður – The largest town in the West Fjords, situated on a spectacular peninsula
- Siglufjörður – A fishing village with a rich and varied history
- Akureyri – The capital of the north and a delightful city from which to explore the Myvatn area
- Husavik – Iceland's whale watching capital
- Seydisfjörður – Explore the East Fjords in a variety of unforgettable ways
- Djupivogur – a brilliant starting point for exploring the world famous Vatnajökull Glacier and the famous Glacier Lagoon
- Vestmannaeyjar – The Westman Islands are a volcanic archipelago off the south coast of Iceland

ARRIVAL AND TRANSFER

Upon arrival at Keflavik Airport, you will be welcomed and transferred to your hotel in Reykjavik.

Depending on your arrival time you can stroll around the most northerly capital in the world or just relax in your room. However, if you love seafood then we recommend trying some of the fish dishes in the Restaurant Reykjavik tonight (payable locally).

FREE DAY AND EMBARKATION IN REYKJAVIK

Your exciting cruise will set sail at approximately 8pm tonight so, you will have the day at leisure in this charming city. There is so much to see and do in this vibrant city and we would be happy to suggest some suitable itineraries for you.

Your ship, the MS Ocean Diamond will be waiting for you in the old harbour, just five minutes from the city centre.

Embarkation will be completed in time for an 8pm sailing.

On board the ship you can settle into your cabin before and explore the ship that will be your base for the next nine nights. A welcome drink and dinner will be served and you can relax in the knowledge that you are in the hands of the expert expedition team - so switch off and enjoy your holiday.

Throughout your cruise the expedition crew will endeavour to take you in Zodiac boat trips to explore certain areas, they will do so as often as they are able. The use of Zodiacs is entirely subject to the weather and so any excursions which are confirmed whilst on board will be an added bonus during your holiday. They will also provide you with factual talks in the auditorium throughout your stay on board, should you wish to attend them.

STYKKISHÓLMUR

This morning you will arrive in Stykkishólmur which is the starting point for your exploration of the Snæfellsnes Peninsula, the incredibly scenic west coast of Iceland. The peninsula is known as 'Iceland in miniature' as here you can find a beautiful array of landscapes from volcanoes to sandy beaches to lagoons.

There are also activities which can be arranged and these can all be found in the '[Personalise](#)' section of the holiday page. Options for today include a wildlife and seafood tasting trip, a bus tour around the peninsula and a trip onto the Snæfellsjökull glacier.

DAY  
4

ISAFJÖRDUR

Today's destination is the idyllic town of Isafjörður, the honorary capital of the Westfjords' region. This secluded peninsula is connected to the mainland of Iceland via a small strip of land and even by Icelandic standards, it remains exceptionally untouched.

The scenery here though is some of the most dramatic on the island, characterised by mountainous peaks and fjords cut deep into the landscape. Here you can enjoy the peaceful silence and the nature that calls the peninsula its home.

Optional tours on this day include sea fishing or a bird watching safari. You can also include a tour to Dynjandi waterfall, the highest (and most impressive) waterfall in the Westfjords or a kayaking trip for something more active.

## SIGLUFJÖRÐUR AND GRIMSEY

This morning you will reach the town of Siglufjörður, a town that was once the centre of the Icelandic herring industry. Here you can learn about the golden age of Icelandic fishing and visit the award-winning herring museum (see '[Personalise](#)' section for details).

In the early afternoon, you will be heading towards Grimsey Island – Iceland's northernmost inhabited island. You will enjoy a two hour walk around the island, which will take you to the spot where the Arctic Circle crosses Iceland.

In the early evening, you will arrive in Akureyri, the capital of the north. Here you can take a stroll through the quaint and friendly town. A highlight of the city is the botanical garden where you can see an impressive variety of native Icelandic flowers, which thrive here despite the location close to the Arctic Circle.

## AKUREYRI

Today the Ocean Diamond will remain in the port of Akureyri, allowing you the opportunity to explore Iceland's north shore. The city itself is home to an exciting array of shops, museums and restaurants, whilst just a short transfer away lies the starkly beautiful wilderness.

The Lake Myvatn region is around 90 minutes away and has a wonderfully contrasting landscape – on one side the rugged remnants of volcanic activity, on the other, fertile plains with lush greenery and varied birdlife.

HUSAVIK

Early in the morning you will arrive in Husavik, known as Iceland's whale capital. There can be up to 15 species of whale visible here as well as dolphins and an array of birdlife.

There are a couple of activities which can be added today; a whale watching trip and a super jeep tour.

SEYDISFJÖRDUR

For your explorations of the East Fjords, the ship will dock in the port of Seydisfjörður, an almost impossibly beautiful region characterised by picturesque fishing villages, steep slopes and panoramic sea views.

Here you can enjoy a delightful variety of optional activities: take a horseback tour along the coast where you will hopefully spot seals and wild reindeer, visit Skalanes Nature Reserve or delve into the region's past with a visit to the wartime museum.

DJUPIVOGUR

The fishing village of Djupivogur is the starting point for exploration of the Vatnajökull Glacier, an expanse of ice so vast that it is larger than all of the other glaciers in Europe combined.

There are two very special shore excursions available for you today which get you up close to this wonderful land of ice. For those who want a seriously close encounter then a snowmobile tour on the ice is the way to go, there's also an adventurous super jeep and hiking trip which offers views from further afield.

One of the most spectacular sights in the area is the famous Glacier Lagoon where icebergs which have been formed by chunks of ice breaking free of the glacier float in the water. Our shore options include a boat trip through the icebergs.

DAY  
10

VESTMANNAEYJAR - THE WESTMAN ISLANDS

Located around five miles from the coast of Southern Iceland, Vestmannaeyjar is a cluster of small islands first formed by volcanic eruptions around 10,000 years ago, with the youngest island, Surtsey, only emerging from the sea in 1963.

You will go ashore at Heimaey, the only inhabited island of the group, for a firsthand look at the destructive power of nature. In 1973 the Helgafell volcano erupted here and in many places you will see houses half buried in lava and ash.

Weather permitting, you will explore in Zodiac boats and circumnavigate the island, and stop at places of interest where you can see local bird life, visit caves and hopefully spot whales.

Optional excursions include a bus tour of the island and the unique chance to play golf in a sunken volcanic crater!

REYKJAVIK

This morning you will return to the port of Reykjavik where it's time for you to bid farewell to the ship.

## Isafjördur - Dynjandi Waterfall

You will drive across mountains and take in the extreme landscape around the Westfjords before arriving at the highest and most impressive waterfall in the area, Dynjandi. Here you have a choice of whether to take the moderate 45-minute walk to get really close to the powerful waterfall or not, it can be seen clearly from the parking space if you prefer not to walk.

## Akureyri - Classic Lake Myvatn

Enjoy one of the most spectacular spots in the island's North; Myvatn is teeming with fauna. You will stop at the Goðafoss, one of the most spectacular waterfalls in Iceland and explore the small settlement of Skutustadagigar. You'll witness lava formations which are said to connect the earth with the infernal regions before relaxing in the geothermal pools at the Myvatn Nature Baths. This is an amazing trip through a land of contrasts.

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## Akureyri - Icelandic nature and culture

During this excursion, you will have the chance to see Iceland's beautiful nature as you drive along Eyjafjord, the longest fjord in Iceland and across the mountain pass of Vikurskard. You will also stop at the spectacular Goðafoss Waterfall, which is known as one of the most beautiful waterfalls in Iceland. Afterwards, it is time for some Icelandic culture - the Laufas farm which dates from 1850. The farm is now a museum and gives you an insight into life during that time.

## Husavik - whale watching by RIB boat

## Husavik - bus tour around the Diamond Circle

A number of Iceland's highlights are visited during this tour. The Asbyrgi Canyon and the Jokulsargljufar Glacial Canyon are spectacular and the 'echoing' cliffs at Hljodaklettur offer some wonderful basalt formations. The most powerful waterfall in Europe, Dettifoss, is also on the route today.

## Seydisfjörður - Horseback wildlife tour in Husey

The history of the Icelandic horse reaches back to the 9th Century. This smaller sized horse is considered to be intelligent, well-tempered and versatile. The farm at Husey is located between two glacial rivers, 37 miles north of Egilsstaðir. The two-hour horseback ride offers a wonderful way to appreciate the beauty of the coast and the mountains nearby. This tour provides endless opportunities for spotting birds and seals.

## Seydisfjörður - Skalanes Nature Reserve

There are very few Icelanders who have visited this secluded and remote area and they are missing out on a real treat. You will explore fascinating archaeological sites with relics from the Viking era. You'll then head along the fjord surrounded by mountains. At Skalanes Nature Reserve you will visit the heritage and nature centre and learn about the efforts to conserve this wild area for future generations. Around 50 different bird species live here in the summer and so the bird watching can be

excellent.

## Vestmannaeyjar - Lava Tour (Pompeii of the North)

In the Westman Islands, you can enjoy a guided tour of Heimaey by bus. This excursion will highlight the power of nature as you witness the semi-buried homes and the volcanic crater which have been caused by recent eruptions. A museum visit gives an insight into the geology of the island and an account of both the 1973 eruption, which damaged the homes and the 1963 eruption which created the island of Surtsey (entrance to the museum is included).

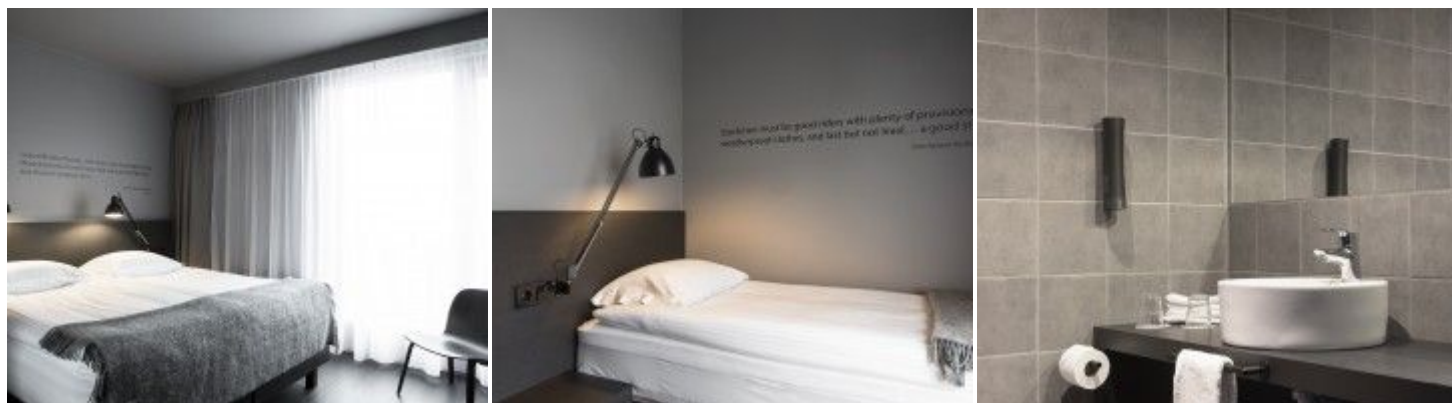

## Included Accommodation

Skuggi Hotel (Nights: 1,11)



This hotel is located in Reykjavik's city centre, close to Laugavegur (which is the main shopping street),

and an array of restaurants and bars. 'Skuggi' is the Icelandic word for 'shade', and the hotel has a fitting interior design of cool greys and calming white. The Skuggi Hotel has 100 rooms, designed with inspiration from the sublime black-and-white nature photography of Icelander Ragnar Axelsson.

## MS Ocean Diamond (Nights: 2-10)



MS Ocean Diamond is a wonderful and modern vessel that has been specially equipped for Arctic voyages with ice-strengthened hull and stabilisers that help to reduce roll. She is an ideal expedition vessel but that does not mean that there is any need to compromise on comfort as the facilities on board are excellent. The experienced and expert crew works with the expedition team to ensure that guests have the best possible experience whilst on board.

She is compact and carries a maximum of 224 passengers, meaning that she can explore further than larger ships. This means that her passengers can take in highlights which may elude larger vessels.

Her average cruising speed is around 15.5 knots and she is the first ever polar passenger ship to be

carbon neutral, with all emissions offset.

## On board facilities

The ship has some fantastic facilities that make it both welcoming and comfortable.

- All meals as listed are included in your stay and they are prepared by the ship's team of chefs. You are sure to experience a wealth of delicious specialities during your voyage. The restaurant offers panoramic views of your surroundings. Breakfast and lunch are a buffet and your evening meal will be à la carte. The dress code is casual and so you can leave your black tie at home and simply come equipped for the variable weather
- Coffee, tea, water, apple and orange juice are included throughout and the lounge on deck 4 serves a late evening snack
- The various deck and observation areas provide ideal viewpoints from which passengers can enjoy the surrounding scenery
- The on board shop is a great place to pick up some souvenirs
- Passengers can browse the books and DVDs in the well-stocked Polar library, sit back in the panorama salon or take advantage of the wellness programmes that are offered, such as yoga classes, massage therapy and aromatherapy treatments
- There will be a range of talks held in the auditorium by local experts on the heritage and wildlife of the regions you are visiting and the ship's Zodiac boats are on hand (when conditions are favourable) to give guests the chance to explore further afield
- Wi-Fi is available on board for an extra charge

## Cabin Types

There are many types of cabin to choose from during your stay. Our holidays are based on Category P but we can arrange for guests to upgrade or downgrade to any of the other options subject to availability. Simply contact our Travel Experts for a quotation.

**Cabin Type P - Outside Cabin with porthole:** These cabins are 19m<sup>2</sup> and contain double/twin beds, en-suite shower room, TV with DVD, safe, wardrobe, refrigerator, individual temperature control, satellite telephone access, hairdryer and two portholes. Please note that some views can be restricted by lifeboats, etc on deck.

## Additional Cabin Options

**Cabin Type O – Outside cabin with obstructed view:** These cabins are 19m<sup>2</sup> and contain double/twin beds, en-suite shower room, TV with DVD, safe, wardrobe, refrigerator, individual temperature control, satellite telephone access, hairdryer and picture window. Please note that the view will be restricted by lifeboats or similar.

**Cabin Type D – Outside cabin with picture window:** These cabins are between 17-19m<sup>2</sup> and contain double/twin beds, en-suite shower room, TV with DVD, safe, wardrobe, refrigerator, individual temperature control, satellite telephone access, hairdryer and picture window.

**Cabin Type A - Balcony suite:** These cabins are 30m<sup>2</sup> and contain a double bed, en-suite bathroom with bath and shower, sitting area, TV with DVD, wardrobe, safe, refrigerator, individual temperature control, satellite telephone access, hairdryer, full-size window with sliding glass door and a balcony.

**Cabin Type B – Suite:** The suites are spacious at 37m<sup>2</sup> and feature either two twins or a double bed as well as an additional two twin beds, two private bathrooms with shower or bathtub, sitting area, TV with DVD-player, wardrobe, safe, refrigerator, individual temperature controls, satellite telephone access, hairdryer and picture window.

**Cabin Type T – Triple cabin with porthole:** These cabins are 19m<sup>2</sup> and contain two twin beds and one upper bed. They are en-suite with shower room, TV with DVD, safe, wardrobe, refrigerator, individual temperature control, satellite telephone access, hairdryer and two portholes. Please note that the view may be obstructed.

## The Specifics

### Holiday group size (approximate)

Approximately 150 - 220 on board the ship but for activities the group size will be much smaller.

### Group Size

We always try to provide an approximation of the group size you can expect to be with for the duration of each of our holidays. It may be that you are joined by others for parts of your holiday (such as transfers and particular activities) but the above number reflects those you can normally expect to be with from beginning to end.
