### Sled Dog Ride in a Winter Wonderland

Experience the splendour of the winter wonderland surroundings during one of the most-loved Arctic activities; dog sledding.

## Northern Lights Photography

This evening activity takes you into the hidden wilderness areas of Jukkasjärvi to get you away from any light pollution and into darker skies, ready for a potential Northern Lights display. While you wait in anticipation, your expert local guide will teach you the basics of night time photography and how to capture the Northern Lights on camera. Warm drinks are also included.

## Northern Lights on Horseback

Go in search of Mother Nature's greatest light show as you travel on horseback into the Arctic night.

Your evening adventure starts with a short bus transfer to the Ofelas Icelandic horse farm where you will meet the animals and help prepare your horse.

After full instructions, you will saddle up and follow the guide for a tranquil ride along Sweden's highest mountain range of Kebnekaise. Keep an eye out for moose and other wildlife which may be present here and

of course, make sure you're looking up at the night sky as the Auroras could appear at any moment.

Back at the farm, you will help unsaddle your horse before heading to a traditional Sámi hut for a dinner made using local ingredients.

## Moose Safari on Horseback

This wildlife experience brings you closer to the wonderful natural surroundings as you ride an Icelandic horse directly through the moose's grazing land.

Your day starts with a transfer to the Ofelas Icelandic horse farm where you will help to prepare the animals for your ride.

Then you will set off to travel through the grazing land of the wild moose where hopefully, you will get to spot some of the animals. This area provides amazing views

over Sweden's highest mountain range, Kebnekaise and is a brilliant way to see more of the winter landscape in daylight.

After returning to the farm, you will help to unsaddle the horses before enjoying a three-course traditional lunch.

## Dog Sledding with Overnight Stay

Combine two of the Arctic's most-loved activities when you take your own team of sled dogs on an overnight Aurora hunting adventure.

This mini expedition starts with a transfer on a snowmobile-pulled sled over the frozen Torne River and to the husky kennel, where you will meet with your loyal team.

After full instructions and a safety briefing, you will step into the role of musher and head out into the winter

wilds.

Your destination is a secluded wilderness camp with welcoming cabins that are situated far away from light pollution and in prime Northern Lights territory. Upon arrival, you can unwind in the traditional sauna before enjoying a two-course dinner. Throughout the evening, make sure you're keeping an eye on the sky for a potential display.

The cabins are simple yet cosy retreats in the Arctic wilds and come equipped with a shared double room. In the morning, you will be served breakfast and then help to harness the dogs before driving your team back to the kennels.

## Driving Your Own Dog Sled - The Ultimate Adventure

Dog sledding is a much-loved Arctic pastime but it is also one of the best ways to see more of the stunning landscape. During this trip, you will get to try your hand as a musher, driving your own team of dogs further into the winter wilderness. This mini expedition starts with a snowmobile-pulled sleigh ride over the frozen Torne River to the husky kennel, where the dogs will more than likely be barking with excitement to get on the trails.

After a full safety briefing and instructions, you will stand on your sled behind your team of dogs and set off with the guide leading the way into the wilds. Halfway, you'll stop at a cosy cabin for a traditional lunch and then you will drive your team back to the kennels where you can help unharness the loyal dogs and take some pictures with them.

Please note: you must be at least 15 years old. Passengers are not allowed to ride with other guests, only with the guide.

## Snowmobile Experience

Snowmobiling is a vital form of transport in the Arctic but during your stay, it serves as an adventurous way to explore the frozen landscape. This shorter tour is perfect for those who want a first taste of this wonderful activity.

After full driving instructions and a safety briefing, you will follow your guide across the spectacular frozen Torne River and through the winter woodlands.

You will travel two per snowmobile with the opportunity to swap drivers. Please note, you must be at least 18 years old and hold a full driving licence to drive a snowmobile. You can drive your own snowmobile for a supplement.

## Arctic Wildlife Safari on Snowmobiles

Explore more of the incredible mountainous scenery in the company of a local guide who can take you on snowmobiles and on the lookout for some of the brilliant wildlife that live here.

You will learn all about the moose and how to track them as well as reindeer and grouse as you snowmobile through the winter surroundings. You will stop for lunch along the way which will be made using local ingredients.

You will travel two per snowmobile with the opportunity to swap drivers. Please note, you must be at least 18 years old and hold a full driving licence to drive a snowmobile. You can drive your own snowmobile for a supplement.

## Cross-Country Skiing

Cross-country skiing is one of the most-loved pastimes in this region so it is a must-do during your visit here. You don't need any prior skiing experience as the guide will teach you the best techniques for this activity. Once you have the hang of it, you will follow the guide on a trail that takes you upstream of the Torne River and to the island of Rimisaari. Here you will warm up with hot drinks and a grilled sausage around an open fire.

After the tour, there is the option to keep the skis for a little longer for some independent exploration.

## Wilderness Skills

The structure floats on the Lulea River during the summer and freezes in place throughout the winter for a peaceful retreat amongst stunning nature.

The Arctic Bath believes in a holistic approach and the four cornerstones of wellness; proper nutrition, regular exercise, peace of mind and care of the face and body. Nutrition is covered in the onsite restaurant which features local, pure and sustainable ingredients. Regular exercise can be achieved with the available activities such as snowshoe hiking and yoga. All of the rooms are surrounded by the forest and offer an unforgettable place in which to end your

holiday.

This one night package is an ideal extension to your trip and includes an overnight stay at the

Treehotel (based on two sharing a tree room, excludes The Dragon Fly or The Cabin), a delicious three-course meal at the nearby Britta's Guesthouse, breakfast and transfers to the airport the following day.

There is no Wi-Fi, running water or electricity in the lodge, making it an ideal location to switch off and relax in the winter wonderland surroundings. Unwind further in the traditional wood-fired sauna as the guide prepares a two-course dinner.

You will travel two people per snowmobile. Please note, you must be at least 18 years old and hold a full driving licence to drive a snowmobile.

# Included Accommodation

ICEHOTEL (Nights: 1-3)



Located on the banks of the magnificent Torne River the ICEHOTEL® in Jukkasjärvi is the original snow and ice (“snice”) hotel and is undoubtedly one of Northern Scandinavia’s most fascinating sites. The concept began when a Swede by the name of Yngve Bergqvist built a small igloo to display locally designed art. Some of the guests asked if they could spend the night and it was from these small beginnings that this concept began, rapidly growing in scale each season.

The classic ICEHOTEL® structure is created usually by mid-December using around 30,000 tonnes of snow and ice with ice blocks harvested from the nearby Torne River. This structure is home to the ice rooms, winter suites and chapel. Come summer, the hotel simply melts back into the river from which it came.

Until recently it has always been necessary to brave the sub-zero temperatures of winter if you want to visit or stay. Happily, for anybody who doesn’t like the cold, there is now a permanent ICEHOTEL® 365 which is open every day of the year. A specially designed, permanent ice art hall housing luxury and art suites, an ice bar, sculpture gallery, and an event hall. The exciting new environmentally-friendly concept holds the same standard and visual design as the purely ice and snow building and is kept at the same temperature via inner cooling tubes.

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## Facilities

It is important to remember that the ICEHOTEL® and ICEHOTEL® 365 also have a “normal” warm side to them. Inside the main warm building, you’ll find a relaxing lounge area, a bar, dressing room, restaurant, warm accommodation options and a gift shop selling gifts and locally sourced handicrafts.

Meals are served in the warm restaurant. The breakfast buffet provides plenty of hot and cold choice to fortify you for the day ahead. Please note that dinner reservations must be made in advance and can be done through us.

If you are spending the night in one of the cold rooms then you’ll change in the facilities provided at the Riverside Lobby next to the main building before walking over to your cold room (approx. 60 to 80 metres).

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## Cold rooms:



## ICEHOTEL®

Inside the cold rooms, the temperature is on average around -5°C, but with the Arctic-grade sleeping bag, insulating reindeer skins and your thermal layers, you will stay surprisingly warm!

There is a range of cold rooms to choose from:

- **Ice rooms:** These are the simplest rooms which we usually book as standard. These rooms are made of snow and ice and had an ice bed with a mattress topped in reindeer skins, as well as some ice carvings and furniture. The ice rooms are closed off from the corridors by thick curtains rather than doors, but the walls of snow and ice ensure excellent sound insulation. There are around 15 ice rooms available for guests.
- **Art suites:** Uniquely and expertly designed, the stunning art suites are envisioned and carved by chosen artists and architects from around the world each season. Each room varies in style and is based around a certain theme, utilising sculptures, light and carvings to set the scene. As with the ice rooms, these are closed off from the corridors using thick curtains. There are around 15 art suites available for guests

## ICEHOTEL® 365

Accommodation at ICEHOTEL® 365 consists of 9 Deluxe Suites and 11 Art Suites. Ice artists from all over the world come to Jukkasjärvi to create these rooms and no two suites are the same. The expertise and skill are remarkable and each artisan carves his or her own unique vision into each room.

Temperatures inside the suites sit constantly between -5°C and -8°C and, we know that sounds cold but, without any wind chill factor, it's very tolerable. This is especially the case when you are lying on your comfortable bed, insulated from the cold by a reindeer skins and a thermal sleeping bag.

There are also lockers where you can leave your valuables overnight as well as toilets, showers and, rather temptingly, a sauna. The warm building also has a small number of bunk beds in case you decide your ice room is not for you.

- **Art Suites 365:** These are the same as the art suites in the ICEHOTEL® but being part of the permanent building allows them to have a proper door. Each is independently designed by chosen artists and architects. There are 12 Art Suites 365 in total.
- **Deluxe Ice Suites 365 (upgrade):** All deluxe suites are individually themed and come equipped with a heated relaxation area. These are the largest cold rooms available and offer incredible ice and art design along with the comfort of your own warm en-suite shower room, toilet and private sauna (as well as space to store your luggage). Each room has a bed with a wooden base and extra thick mattress topped with reindeer hides and thermal sleeping bags. There are 10 deluxe suites available.

## Warm rooms:

Whether you travel in the summer or winter, however, you don't have to sleep in a cold room, as you can upgrade to one of the lovely, warm rooms, chalets and suites on site for the duration of your stay.



- **Kaamos Hotel Room:** All warm hotel rooms are spacious and tastefully decorated with natural materials. Each room has two beds, a desk, seating area with two armchairs and a coffee table and the en-suite bathroom comes equipped with heated floors. You can also upgrade a superior room for more space.
- **Nordic Hotel Chalet:** These are designed to accommodate up to four people. Each has one double/twin bedroom and one room with bunk beds, making them ideal for families or small groups of friends. Each has an ensuite bathroom with shower, small living room with a fridge and kettle and TV.
- **Arctic Chalet:** These have a double and a single room are best suited to three people. Each chalet is en-suite and has a shower room, a small living area, fridge, kettle, TV and telephone.
